SOME DEFINITIONS/INTERPRETATIONS FROM THE "INSTRUKTIES VOOR DE TELLERS"

Education or training: any kind of education/training which the respondent is following or has followed and which is specifically directed towards the practice of a certain job or trade. Questions are not only about the level of education (elementary school, MAVO, HAVO, etc.) but also about the type of education (e.g. LTS-electrotechnical, P- or T-currents or MAVO 3 or 4)
Profession: persons working half days or part time are also to be considered as working persons. Please specify the NAME as well as the DESCRIPTION of the profession or work (sub-question 3 or sub-question 12), in other words e.g. not just "administrative" but secretary, typist, etc. and works e.g. in the bookkeeping department and/or helps with answering the telephone, etc.
Note: with public servants also note the official RANK and with teachers the course(s) being taught.
Sub-question 6: employer (small independent) is considered to be only he or she who runs a company (business, industry, etc.) and is OWNER. The difference between an employer and a small independent lies only in the number of people they employ. People with an independent profession are those with a specific profession and are not directly employed (e.g. doctors, lawyers, architects, tax consultants, notaries of the public, etc.) Wage earners or employees are divided into two categories: those in permanent employ or employed for a certain length of time and those in part-time or free-lance employ. Earning a wage or salary in permanent employ are those persons who are or will be employed for at least six months, by means of a verbal or written contract (a CAO (collective labor agreement) is also a contract!) Earning a wage or salary in part-time or free-lance employ are those persons who are or will be employed less than six months, with or without contract. People working somewhere for instance for only one week (job-pickers!) should also be noted in this category.
